## Position Summary

The qualified candidate will have expertise in the architectural history of the islands, a strong understanding of the requirements of the Hawai‘i Revised Chapter (HRS) 6E Historic Preservation Program, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), and local regulations as they pertain to historic resources, and be comfortable working through complex and regulatory-dense projects with clients. The candidate should have previous experience conducting business development, preparing scopes and work and cost estimates, and leading proposal efforts to conduct historic resource surveys, evaluations, and related technical documents in compliance with HRS 6E, NEPA and Section 106 of the NHPA. The ideal candidate will additionally possess broader Pacific expertise and be able to demonstrate adequate professional experience evaluating historic resources in consideration of NRHP and the Hawai‘i Register of Historic Places designation criteria and integrity requirements; researching and writing historic context statements; assessing impacts/effects to historical resources/historic properties; and will have a working knowledge of the Secretary of the Interior’s Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties.
